
Dear parents and carers,

Our last Newsletter for Term 3 and I would like to thank you all for your support and friendship during the last 6 weeks. I have been asked to stay on at Johns River until the end of the year while Ms Quinlivan continues on leave.

You may have noticed Mr T, Miss Craig and myself moving like little work ants around the school lately. We have been busily piecing together the External Validation report which will be presented in Term 4. External Validation is an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgement about their practice. We are looking forward to showcasing the great things being done at Johns River Public School. A big thank you to Mrs Wade who has worked closely with both Mr T and myself to ensure lessons are running as usual and the day to day activities are being managed without disruption to the children's education.

Two very important notices that I ask you to please be aware of and consider.

This week we held the Road Safety Training Day for many local schools. This training highlights the responsibility of parents and schools to ensure the safety of all children especially around drop off and pick up times. The first thing to consider is how and where you are parking at drop off and pick up times. Whilst we are a small school we are still governed by the same safety considerations of a large school. It only takes 1 car and 1 child for things to go horribly wrong. PLEASE park on the school side of the road with your car facing the flow of traffic. PLEASE do not allow your child to enter into the car from the driver's side. If accessing the car from the safest (curb) side is not an option then please ensure you are holding your child's hand and supervising them into the car. If your child is riding a bike to and from school, they must have a correctly fitted helmet on at all times. When crossing the road, riders are to dismount and cross while walking their bikes. Any child who is walking home will need to supply written information to the school advising when this is to occur. It is a recommendation of Transport for NSW that all children under 10 years of age



Late arrivals and Early Pick Ups

If your child is arriving to school at any time after the morning bell has rung, you are required to sign them into school. If you are collecting your child early from school you will also need to sign your child out of school. All early leavers and late arrivals will be recorded on the schools electronic roll. PLEASE NOTE: If the class is outside of the classroom when you arrive/leave you will still need to sign your child in/out.

A very big **congratulations** to all the students who represented our school at the Soccer Gala Day. I was very proud of the never give up attitude and sportsmanship displayed by each and every one of our students. While we didn't take out 'first place', we certainly received many compliments from other schools for our ability to walk over to the other teams and shake their hands after a well-played game. You can all be very proud of yourselves.
